

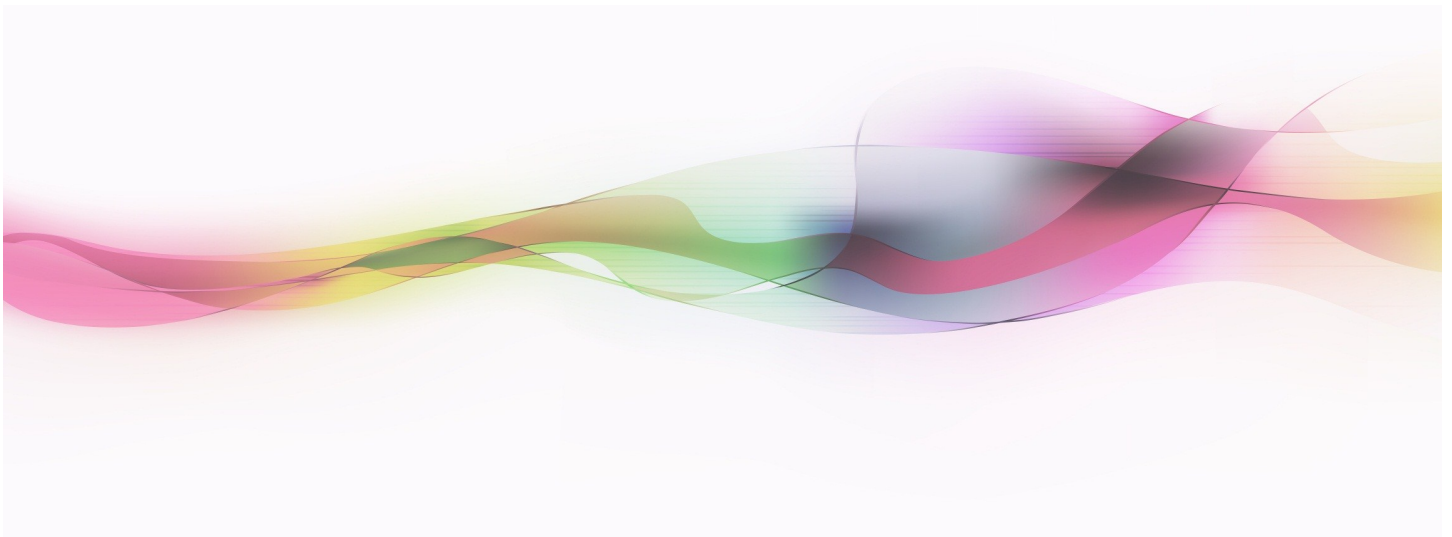
The Beautiful Project

- This is not a juried art show and there will be no sales of art at the event. Artists have the option to provide contact info.
- Artists should be members, regular attendees or friends with a connection to IPC.
- Paper entries must be mounted and/or matted with name on back. Frames are optional.
- Artwork and applications will be evaluated based on appropriate content and subject matter and will be reviewed by a committee.
- # of pieces accepted will depend on # of applicants and available space. Suggested limit - 3 pieces, unless approved by Selection Committee.
- We look forward to seeing your best work in the art show so give yourselves plenty of time for creative expression.

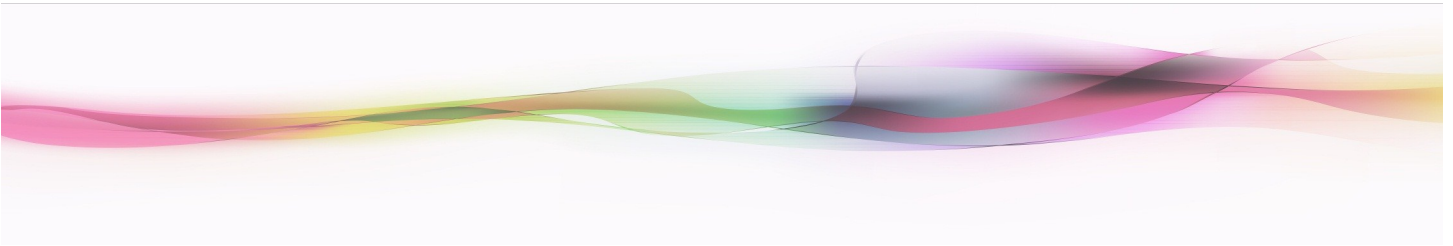
